

Pupil Premium

We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils in our school. We endeavour to deliver provision specifically targeted at vulnerable groups and disadvantaged pupils. (Though we recognise that not all pupils who receive pupil premium will be vulnerable or socially disadvantaged.)

All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress and moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this will be in literacy and numeracy skills.

2014/15

We received £5200 pupil premium funding for the financial year 2014 - 2015 which allowed us to:

- Purchase sensory resources which increased targeted pupils personal, social and emotional development as well as communication needs
- Provide small group work with an experienced Higher Level Teaching Assistant to overcome gaps in pupils learning through a personalised spelling programme
- Provide additional TA hours to support to a small group and run additional 1:1 reading sessions
- Purchase some additional playtime resources to encourage social skills in a play environment

The impact of this funding has been an increased participation in whole class activities and much more active in the learning areas within the classroom. Pupil progress in core subjects was also above average, with accelerated progress in reading. Socially the children have gained confidence and more self-esteem is evident which has a positive effect on the learning experiences in school.
